- We have an Anti-bullying assembly week every year;
- The Caring Crusaders, our very own YR6 Anti-bullying Ambassadors, are here to help during playtimes and lunchtimes;
- Captain Carer, our worry box, is in a place where pupils can drop in a note stating any worries or concerns;
- We follow class rules and make sure we stick to them;
- Using rewards for good/positive and respectful behaviour;
- We are able to tell a teacher/adult or Caring Crusader if we are being bullied or know of someone else being bullied;
- We can speak to our pastoral worker, Mrs Clarke.
