

What if I can't attend the sessions?

Each session needs to be attended by your child and by a responsible adult who has regular contact with them outside of school to qualify for the £20 worth of books. This could be mum, dad, nanny, grandad or other extended family members. You are welcome to send different adults to each session, although we feel that you would get more from the project if the same people attend each session.

When and where will the sessions be held?

All sessions will be held at school. The timings of the sessions will be after school at 3:20PM directly after school has finished. Sessions last no more than one and a half hours.

Is there anything else?

As well as the workshops and the free books, each family, who attend all sessions are entered into a draw to win a voucher for a family day out at an appropriate venue.

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What is the Generations' Project?

Our Generations' Project is a fantastic opportunity for families, pupils and school to work together to boost academic progress, develop new skills and raise future aspirations.

Who is the Generations' Project for?

The Generations' Project is open to any families who have a child who has been in receipt of Pupil Premium funding in the last six years, even if they do not access this funding at the moment.

What does the Generations' Project involve?

The Generations' Project will be a series of workshops that families can attend to help boost academic progress, develop new skills and raise future aspirations. For each session that the family attends they will earn £20 worth of books at the end of the project. There will be six sessions in total, resulting in a possible £120 worth of books!

What will the sessions be?

There will be six sessions differing from last year. These will be as follows:

- 1) Maths Problem Solving
- 2) Science Acid or Base / pH Testing
- 3) Art Challenge
- 4) Sport Challenge
- 5) Creative Literacy—Poetry
- 6) Outdoor Education

Each session will be full of fun activities for children and families and will not last more than 1 hour 30 minutes.

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Free books?

For each session that you attend you will earn £20 worth of books. This could total £120!

After all the sessions have been completed the school will be providing a coach and taking all of the participating families to the Norfolk Children's Book Centre in Norwich. Your child will be able to select any, and as many, books as they like within the total that you have earned. The Children's Book Centre staff will be on hand to guide you to the best books for your child's age.

Where is the money coming from?

Any child who has received Pupil Premium funding at any point in the past six years gets a small sum of money in our yearly budget. This money should be used to raise standards.

Previously we have used this money for intervention groups, pastoral support, school trips and staffing. This year we will be using a small proportion of this money to fund the Generations Project.

Why should I take part?

£120 worth of books!

If that does not convince you then hopefully the opportunity to work with your child in school and help raise attainment will do the job. We already have lots of intervention groups running in school but research has shown that the most effective form of intervention involves parents working alongside school.

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
